After candidates have completed a minimum of 60 semester hours and fulfilled all other admission requirements, they should submit an application for Admission to the Teacher Education Program (Upper Division).

The application for Upper Division must be completed and submitted to BCOE room 2101 no later than:

- * **September 15** to register for Upper Division courses for Spring
- * **February 15** to register for Upper Division courses for Summer and Fall

Each completed application must be reviewed and approved by the Upper Division Admission and Retention Committee. If all requirements are met, student will be allowed to register for Upper Division courses the following semester. Upper Division courses are the courses on the front designated with the “+” symbol.

Upper Division Applications submitted after the deadlines listed above will NOT be reviewed until after the next deadline.
