This teaching field also requires passage of the Praxis II tests with a score of 165 on the PLT 7 - 12 (0524) & Option 1: a score of 560 on the Biology & General Science (0030) & 132 on the Physics (0265) or 152 on the Chemistry (0245) or 151 on the Earth Science (0571) OR Option 2: 520 on the Chemistry, Physics, & General Science (0070) & 148 on the Biology Content Knowledge (0235) in order to be eligible to student teach.
