This teaching field also requires the passage of the Praxis II tests with a score of 168 on the PLT 5-9 (0523) and passing scores on the Specialty Test designated for each concentration area in order to be eligible to student teach. **Minimum requirements for teachers’ licenses are determined by the Ohio Department of Education; if those requirements change, they become effective immediately at Youngstown State University.** (YSU Undergraduate Bulletin)
